The Curriculum

Our Early Intervention Programs use the WA K-Y12 Curriculum, Early Years Learning Framework for Australia and the Australian Curriculum to inform our planning and practice.

Our programs provide opportunities for;

- Group and individual sessions
- Academic skills in all curricular area
- Addressing of specific needs e.g. sensory integration, effective communication, a sense of well-being
- Learning through play, experiential learning
- Child-centred learning approaches, confident and involved learners
- Opportunities to grow and develop as a valued member of their community, with a strong sense of identity



My Time

My Time groups are for parents and carers of children with a disability, developmental delay or chronic medical condition.

Toddler and Pre-Kindy sessions are available for children attending with a family member. Children may then have an option to move on to Kindergarten and Pre-Primary.

Conductive Education (CE)

Carson Street School is unique in that it has the state's **only** Conductive Education program for children with motor impairments.

Parent and Child sessions are available for children of 0-4 years attending with a family member. Children may then have an option to move on to Kindergarten and Pre-Primary.

Kindy, Pre-Primary and Beyond

Students in the My Time or Conductive Education 0-4 programs may have the opportunity to progress through the Primary School system at Carson Street from Kindergarten through to Year 7. From there students transition to High School.

Specialist Services

Therapy provision: Staff at Carson Street will work with Therapy Service Providers.

Medical Support: The school nurse is responsible for planning, providing and supervising school aged health-related services and procedures that support the education programs. The nurse also runs Parent Information coffee mornings to which all families are invited.

Hydrotherapy is provided by qualified Swimming Teachers.
