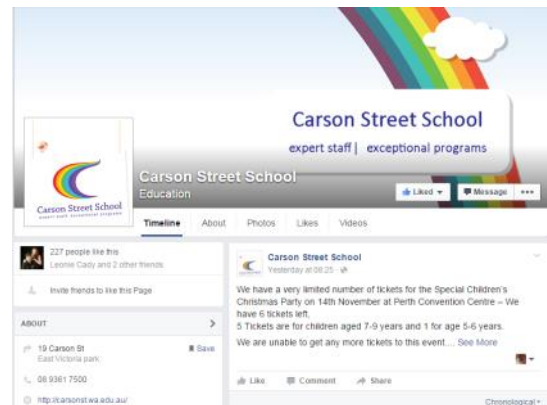


Marketing in 2015

P&C President Liz Green was seconded for the Pozible project.

The group is always looking for new ways to promote and support school programs.

One example of innovation was the successful Pozible campaign this year (Crowd Funding) in order to raise funds for a Community Support Officer. This was an interesting project which highlighted the individual expertise of the members in planning and marketing so that our goal of \$10,000 was reached. The web site is updated by Lisa. Our Facebook page updated regularly by Dallas has proved a quick and efficient way of getting messages to families and supplements the newsletter items, edited by Lisa, is always very well received by the school community. The school letterhead has been redesigned in line with the web design.

Dinner for Dreams

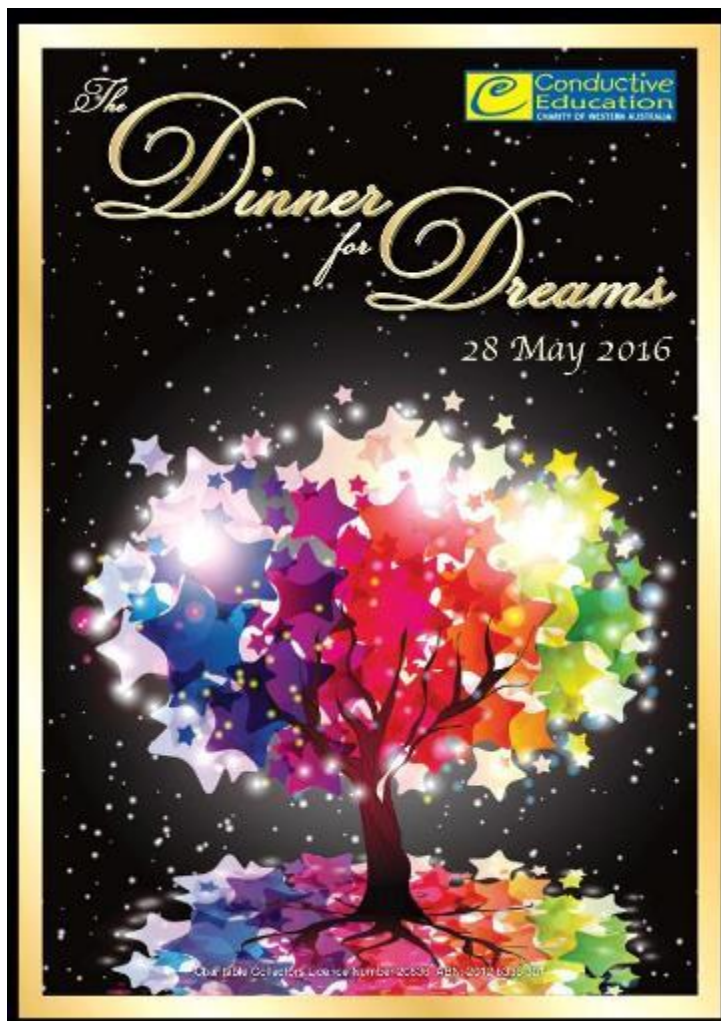
