Best wishes for the term three break from all at Carson Street.



Musa's baby brother came to visit!



Massive cheers for our CECWA student Jack and his family for being part of the 2016 City to Surf and raising \$779 for CECWA!!!



CECWA Report



High School CE program

One of the main focuses of the CECWA committee this year has been the creation of a high school program that our children can progress to that will incorporate, if not a true CE program initially, one that embraces aspects of CE. We have been busy working on this from many angles and we feel that we are very close to making this program a reality. We have had a number of discussions with Carson Street and Kensington High School, which at this stage seems to most likely location where a program will be offered. We have also been preparing a Telethon grant application to help support the program for the first few years while it becomes established and student numbers grow to a level that is self-sustaining.

Satellite Class Emergency

Some of you will already be aware that unfortunately Burbridge will no longer host the Satellite CE class for our north of the river students. We have asked the Department of Education for help to relocate the class to an alternative north of the river school, but the response has not been encouraging. In the very near future we may be asking all our CE parents to get behind this campaign. We believe it is important to continue to have an option in the north so that the travel logistics do not prove a barrier for our children. Committee Positions and CECWA Meetings

The annual general meeting is just around the corner and we will be seeking nominations for executive and non-executive committee members. It is only parent and teacher pressure on the Department of Education that keeps this program running. The lack of support for the north of the river class is a very clear reminder of this. We must not only continue to keep this charity alive, but grow this charity in order to ensure a strong foothold in Western Australia's education system.
