Burbridge Class





There was a train ride. Jack and Grace B were giggling and cheering the train.





I would also like to thank our amazing, talented and passionate Teacher Conductors, ACE Teachers and Education Assistants who not only provide a wonderful program of education for our children, but contribute to both the administration and fundraising activities of CECWA. And finally, John Exeter and the board of Carson Street School, who fully embrace and support the CE program.

As the year commenced, we were all busy trying to put together the 2016 Dinner for Dreams which was held at the Hyatt hotel in May. Not only was it an enjoyable night for all, but we also raised an amazing sum of around \$30,000 which was extremely impressive in the current economic climate.
