




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Room 9

Lendlease celebrates its 20th annual Community Day with Carson Street School

Carson Street School is one of the many worthwhile causes that received a helping hand from Lendlease staff today, as they celebrated their 20th annual Community Day.

In September each year, Lendlease employees across the globe work alongside their colleagues, community partners, family and suppliers to provide much-needed support.

Today almost 50 staff from Lendlease spent the day at the school in East Victoria Park providing general facility upkeep services. The work included painting, gardening and building maintenance and creating some new play spaces for the students.

Carson Street School is the State's only Education Support Primary School, and it educates students whose needs are such that they are not presently being integrated into the regular school system.

Group Head of Sustainability at Lendlease, Geoff Dutaillis said Community Day reinforced and developed strong community partnerships.

Community Day is one of the Lendlease Foundation's most popular programs, with over 5,000 people from around the world taking part in more than 350 projects, each year. Since Community Day started in 1996, Lendlease has volunteered more than 600,000 hours or the equivalent of 68 years.

Last year, approx. 5,400 Lendlease employees participated in Community Day projects around the world, representing an estimated contribution of over \$2.5 million in value for the communities in which we participate.

Staff Development: Team-Teach

More than 60 staff including teachers, education assistants and school leaders were trained in Team-Teach this term. Team-Teach provides training in positive handling strategies for responding to and managing challenging behaviours. It is an holistic approach to behaviour management and the strategies used are actively committed to minimising risk. The Team-Teach approach is recommended by the Department of Education WA to support Behaviour Management in Schools.

Team-Teach is one of a suite of Behaviour Management strategies used at Carson Street School. These strategies are based upon a framework that supports positive reinforcement for appropriate behaviour and Positive Behaviour Support for students who require behavioural intervention. Staff aim to develop behaviour management strategies based upon self-regulation and a desire to do things because they are right, not because someone in authority insists that they are done.


