The training will take place over the next two years and is being carried out through the Conductive College at the National Institute for Conductive Education, UK, Birmingham City University and is generously funded by the Conductive Education Charity of WA.

the UK, joined Carson Street School at the start of this term. It's been


invaluable having her as part of the team and she will be a great support for the MDC trainees.




Red Gum


This term Red Gum class are learning about family. We have started off by talking about our Mums. Below you can see the portraits that the students have drawn of their Mums.



Thanks also to the Rotary Club of Como has also donated towards a gate near the front office. We really love our new gates!




