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Room 9

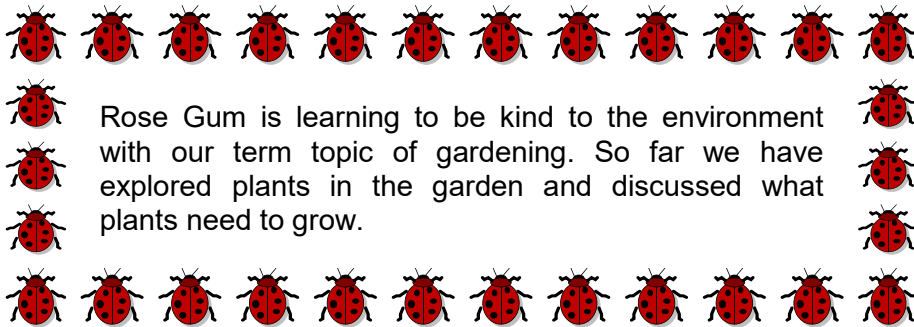
Room 9 students have been keeping busy and having fun learning so far this term. We got to practice our fine motor skills in a game of pass the parcel for Amalie's birthday party.
