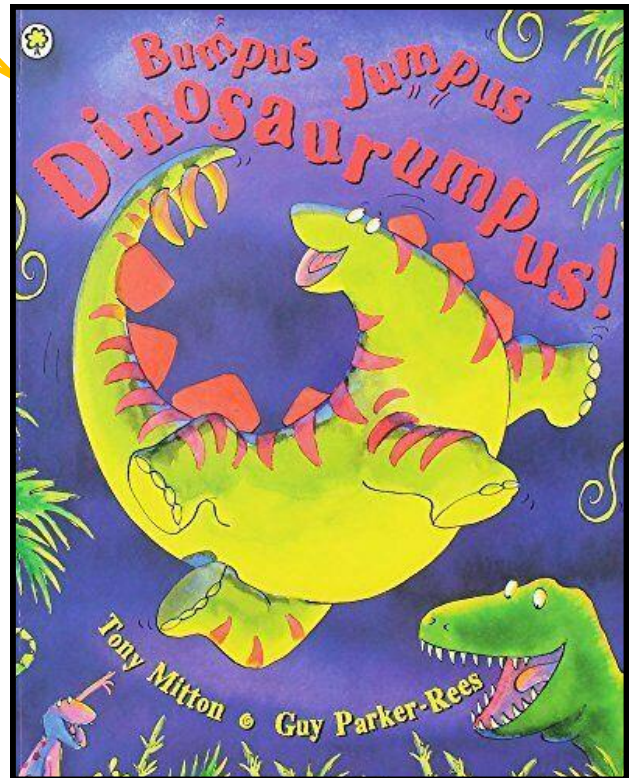
Review of 'Bumpus Jumpus Dinosaurumpus!' by Tony Mitton and Guy Parker-Rees

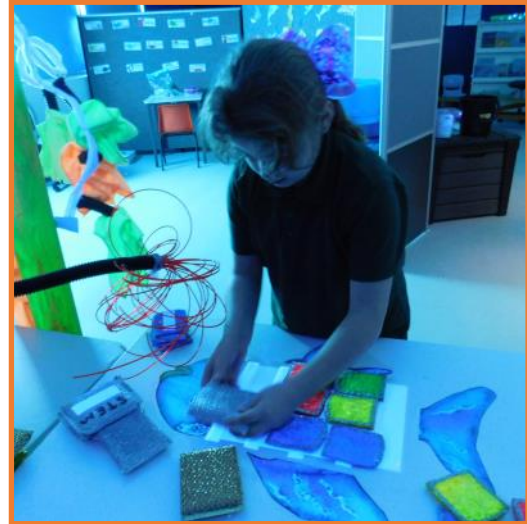
