We have enjoyed learning about light and space in various settings and having so much fun doing SO.



Winter Bugs

It's that time of the year again when everyone is getting colds, flu and viruses. As you are aware many of our students have a compromised immune system and can get very sick, very quickly. This year with the risk of COVID-19 it is even more important to be vigilant. To help prevent your child and the other children and staff getting a cold/flu the following will help everyone stay healthy and out of hospital.



- Wash hands after blowing nose or eating.
- Use tissues once and then throw them in the bin. (Avoid using handkerchiefs.)
- Make sure your child has a balanced diet with plenty of healthy foods.
- Keep children away from smoke it irritates their eyes and nasal passages, making it more likely that they will catch a cold.

No treatment will cure a cold or make it go away more quickly, but you can help your child to feel more comfortable by keeping them at home if they have a cough, cold, fever or pain. Give them extra fluids if possible and allow them to rest to recover.

Germs are spread easily to classroom staff and other students so please keep your child home if they are unwell. If you are unsure if you child is well enough to come to school contact the health centre on 9361 7500 to talk with one of the Nurses.

The Stan Perron Immunisation Centre at Perth Children's Hospital is open for influenza vaccinations. Patients are encouraged to phone ahead or book an appointment. The clinic is located at Level 1 Clinic D. Perth Children's Hospital.
