




Orange Gum


The Student Council have suggested names for the new bus, the voting has been completed by the students and the announcement is that the name of the new bus is:

been working hard in class in the lead up to the end of the year. Red Gum successfully presented their assembly item recently and did a fantastic job. Now to work on our concert item.










Yellow Gum



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


LOOSE CHANGE CHALLENGE
