Facilities Upgrades

As our school enrolments increase, we continue to upgrade and improve our school facilities and environments. The current building projects are almost completed and we hope to



relocate our Health Centre and make use of new office areas in the near future. Bathroom upgrades are almost completed, with students and staff already using these refurbished areas. Although delays have occurred and we have occasionally been inconvenienced, the finished product is well worth the wait.

Government Grant

We were recently informed that the school will receive a \$100,000 government grant for a new purpose-built cover over six existing parking bays near the Therapy Focus building. I would like to congratulate and commend our P&C for their efforts in securing this funding as their commitment and passion underpinned our success. This covered area will provide safe and secure access for students, families and carers

when dropping off or picking up their child from school. The construction has been scheduled for December 2021 school holidays to minimise disruption to the school.



Creative Learning Experiences

Throughout Term 3, we have provided a range of creative learning experiences for the students. We recently celebrated NAIDOC Week with the Bilja Kaatijin incursion, a Yirra Yaakin Theatre Company Production. Bilja Kaatijin means "Fresh Water Knowledge" in Noongar and this performance was the fourth and final story in Yirra Yaakin's 'Kaatijin' series - and our students have participated in all of them! Thanks to teacher Deanne Jones for organising this special event and accompanying learning

was a fun activity, I think we are ready for some warmer weather now!










REACH

Welcome to Term 3.

Our theme for this term is transport!

During Term 3 REACH will be learning about different ways of getting around and more importantly, understanding road safety!

Orange Gum

When it comes to sensory, Orange Gum really does it often. We have so many different types of sensory input and stimulating/calming activities that even we get lost in amongst it!

From swings, spinners and trampolines for vestibular input to big screen audio and visual; weighted blankets, pillows, beanbags, materials that are smooth, rough, slinky, fuzzy, metallic, soft; balls of every size and colour; tactile pasta, rice, sand, jelly, play dough, marshmallow playdough (so you can eat it and not have unquenchable thirst or constipation!); shaving cream, goop; twiddles; noise cancelling headphones and Bluetooth speakers; food that is tasty or bland, crunchy or smooth; aromas that stimulate or calm; massage and tactile applicators (brushes and textures); heavy things to push or carry; a room that is stark or awash in colour, lights on or dimmed, air warm, cool or cold depending on the need; and this is before we even start the lessons.

It's a balancing act that we work on each day to ensure that every child has the best possible chance of engaging in school activities with all of their sensory needs catered for whilst not impinging on the needs of another, because you have to know that if one wants stimulating activities there will be another who needs calming. It's definitely a full time job!









Green Gum Green Gum students love the outdoors. If asked what their favourite time of the day is we're 100% certain they'll all say 'playtime.' Playtime is a great opportunity for our young learners to use their senses to actively explore their world.

Banksia loves sensory activities. In our classroom, we provide all different sensory experiences through activities like art, stories and science.

Our term topic is 'Under the Sea'. The stories we have read this term are Hello Ocean, Commotion in

the Ocean and Sea Stars.

Students have made oceans in a bottle, painted ocean scenes, and bubble wrap print sea stars.













Room 9

Our theme this term is 'Taking care of me.' We have been learning about what we need to survive, things like food, shelter, clothing and what makes each person happy.

Food is the most popular need by all living things and children were given a variety of fruits and foods to explore. For sensory we have been exploring different foods, fruits and vegetables and describing whether they are smooth, rough, soft or hard.

Children have enjoyed the sensory sessions coming up with adjectives to describe what they think about each fruit using their eye gaze devices.
