The song was ok. I have seen the book before.


Gabriella, aged 4

## Interview with...The Police

Mounted Police officers Matt, with his horse Mance, and Tahlia, with her horse Bailey, answer more questions.

Do you ever go in a car? Minnie
Yes, we have a police car that
tows the horse floats.

Do you read magazines?

Not on the horses, but if there is one around we would read it.

Where are you going? Ayub

We go anywhere that we are needed. We serve the whole of WA.

Can your horse run fast and stop? Evie

They can walk fast, and run very fast!! The Police rider gives them instructions with their bits and bridles, reins, and feet in the stirrups. They can stop, turn, and go backwards.



Do you eat and drink on the horse? Russell

Sometimes we can be out for hours so we keep some snacks in our saddle bags.

Do your horses like to jump? Do they like what they are doing? Zack

They can jump over things and they are very good at it. Horses get lots of good food, regular vet checks, get their feet washed every day, and have farriers to check their hooves and make and fit their shoes. They do lots of exercises for their bodies and brains. They like what they do, and are very calm and happy.

## Interview with...The Police

Can your horses shift weight and put their feet up? Charlotte

Yes, horses shift weight all the time when they are standing. They can also lift their feet and even rest their feet on something. And, like you guys, when their helpers prompt them, they will lift their feet so they can be cleaned (every morning) and shoed.

How do horses communicate?

They communicate with their ears, for example, if their ears are pointed right back, it means they are really not happy. Their nostrils also flare if they are upset, and they will stamp their feet, and swish their tail.

Do you like night time? (the horses)

They are very sensitive at night, their senses are very heightened. And, like us, they like to sleep at night.

Uh oh, the horses can't have toys.

The horses can't have toys while they are working. But, if they are having a rest in a paddock, they have a big ball with food inside. They roll it around and eat and play.

Do horses go to school? Are they clever? Tyler


They go to a sort of school – police horse training school. They learn how to be calm with loud noises and how to stay calm and still if things are thrown at them. They learn how to jump over obstacles, move sideways, backwards, forwards, and turn in a very tight circle. And yes, they are very clever!!

There are 2 places the horses stay at night; a farm at Herne Hill, Swan Valley, where they can rest in a paddock, and stables in Maylands, where they stay under cover. They also like liquorice!!!!




He took important phone calls and did some computer work, whizzing through important Principal reports.

Look at the students all playing together and having fun at the playdate. Well done River.








# The Twelve Days of Christmas







On the first day of Christmas my true love gave to me, 1 stop sign. Nate


On the second day of Christmas my true love gave to me, 2 red bikes with bells. Mia














On the ninth day of Christmas my true love gave to me, 9 visits to the zoo. Mia


