Books are great. I like to read them with my carers, especially books about monsters. Alisa— Green Faction Captain


I like reading because I learn about pirates and magic tricks. Ryder– Red Faction Captain






Adjectives


Authors use lots of adjectives, which are describing words, to make their writing more interesting. Blue Gum students are great at this.

















Get Writing

If you want to be a great author, it can help to start writing about something that you know. Our Reach friends have written about their weekly community access to help start their writing journey.













Illustrations

Jordan, you were a fantastic Principal.






Faction Update
