


What's The Weather Minnie?

"When it is snowy I like to have a warm bath."










"When it is windy I like to play with my pets."

> Where are you going Mrs Hamling?


"I am going to make a cup of tea."

Nate Investigates



Straight from her third place win at the New York Marathon, 2 time gold medal Paralympian, winner of the Athlete of the Year at the Women in Sport Awards 2022, and WA Nominee for Young Australian of the Year (phew!!!), Madison De Rozario granted the Red Gum students, and a few of their friends, a very special interview. Sending her responses via video, the students were able to see Madison respond to each of their questions, and they even got to meet her dog. What an amazing opportunity to hear from such a strong athlete. I hope this inspires our students to aim high... you can all do anything!!



Interview With... Madison de Rozario

Can you walk? No, not even a little bit. I use a wheelchair to get around all the time.

Can you drive a car? Yes, I can drive a car. I have hand controls that sit in my hand rather than using the pedals.

What food do you like to eat? I love to eat vegetables.

Do you live by yourself or do you have someone to help you? I live mostly by myself but also with my dog Sebastian.

How many gold medals have you won? 2 at the Tokyo Paralympic games.

River asks:

Have you seen Bluey and if so, do you like it?

I have seen Bluey. It's great, I love it.

Do you wheel around with your gold medal on?

I don't, but when my friends come over they do wear them.

I like reading books about dinosaurs. Do you like books about dinosaurs? I absolutely love dinosaurs, I think they are so cool. I don't sleep very well so I find myself staying up late and reading about dinosaurs.

A very BIG Carson Street "Thank You" to Madison for taking the time to answer all of our questions. We think you are awesome!


The Best Story Ever

Story Time


The Kindy class chose to review 'Would you Like a Banana?' by Yasmeen Ismail. The bright colour and funny picture on the front cover, certainly got their attention.
