Adrien means business!


Status: **PASSED**


Here is a clueone of them writes about a sheep that we need to find and the other writes about a journey all around Australia.


Yes! Mem Fox and Alison Lester have answered the questions of some of our Red Gum and Wisteria friends. Amazing!!!





Sometimes authors can write a story together and share ideas. Pre Primary students Horatio, Jordan, Trey and Tyler got together to write this story.


The boys used PODD and a WordPower system to write their story.








Emily was inspired to write a story after creating a clay model of an alien. Her alien is a boy called Cocopuff, who is 100,000,000 years old! He has two pink eyes, a red mouth, a red belly, a tail, and two antennae. He likes to eat chips and drink milk, he lives in a treehouse outside of Banksia class, he likes the iPad and Roblox and doesn't like the dark.

Here is her story, with all of her own words, dictated to an adult using her voice...







Emily has illustrated her whole book. If you would like to read it, we will put it on display in the library.


Chloe in Kindy could not wait to write her own story, inspired by The Magic Hat, by Mem Fox. I'm not sure I could have written such a great story when I was in Kindy Chloe! Wow!

Chloe used her eye gaze technology to create this amazing book.











When writing, it can help to start by writing about something, or someone, we know and love. Haydn chose to write about Granny.

Haydn wrote his story using his WordPower device. He selected the words and then worked with his helper to put the story together.

"My Granny asked me what I wanted to eat. I wanted a muffin. Granny baked the muffin for me. It was an apple and strawberry muffin. It was yummy, yummy, yummy!"

Aaliyah chose to write about animals...something lots of us like. She wrote her story using PODD and added extra descriptions and ideas using her voice.

"The pet cat was big and hungry. It ate beef and banana. The cat was scary!"

Charlie also wrote a story about animals. Writing about things that make us smile is a good place to start when we begin our journey as authors.

Charlie used a PODD book to write his story, with Partner Assisted Auditory and Visual Scanning.

"Monkey is fast and stinky.

Monkey is red, yellow and green.

Monkey likes toys and dress ups."

Sometimes it can be good to write a story that just makes us laugh. Abigail laughed and laughed and laughed when she wrote this story! Abigail used PODD on iPad to select her words and then worked with her helper to put her sentences together.

'Instead of going to school, my friends Ayub and Wira went to a wedding and a birthday party by car and motorbike. The weather was windy and cloudy. Then they vomited!! It was silly to eat spicy and hot tomatoes and drink cold milkshakes and spicy and sweet water!'

Giving a story a title is a great idea. Wira has chosen the title 'Decorate' for his story about an emu.

Wira wrote his story using a mixture of PODD and Eye Gaze technology

'Decorate'

'One Saturday afternoon, Emu was feeling excited because he was going to a party. But then he got a runny nose and had to go to the Dr where he grasped a thermometer and they put a sling on his back. It was funny.'

Mirielle was inspired to write after reading 'I'm Australian Too' by Mem Fox. She looked at all the pictures with great interest and then wrote this beautiful story.

Mirielle used a PODD book to write her story.

I am **SO PROUD** of the amazing stories that these students have written. I think they are all fantastic and I am sure that Mem Fox and Alison Lester will think they are too.




Well done everyone. You are the Achieving Kind!


I liked this book.


This book is fun, like riding a bike. Aaliyah–aged 5

I didn't like this book. It was noisy and scary! Haydn– aged 4




This book was fun! 5 stars! My friends should read it. Wiraaged 5

This was a good book. You can play with it but not feel it. Abbie– aged 5








I give this book 5 stars. It is good.
I liked it because it talks about babies. My favourite character was the monkey because it was good. Thumbs up! Wayne— aged 12




I liked this book. I thought it was funny. My friends should read it. Mirielle– aged 5





This book was bad but clever! 3 stars. Abbie-aged 5





This book was good...no, great! 3 stars. Wira— aged 5
