
## Yirra Yaakin Theatre Company: Lingo Lah Lah


This term we are focusing on 'In the Garden' and students are learning things like, parts of a plant, how to grow fruit and vegetables and learning their way around garden centres.


#### Jarrah


These sessions are based at Brighton Beach in Summer and Leighton Beach in Winter from 7am to 1pm Monday-Saturday (weather permitting).


## Banksia
