The 2023 school year is over already!! How is that possible?



Do you have a problem that no one else can help solve? If so, you should speak to Miles. He is full of amazing advice to chase all of your problems away.


Dear Miles, Help! We are getting a new puppy soon and I don't know what things I should buy for it to play with. What do you suggest? Thank you. Shona

Experiment 1- Taste the Rainbow

You will need:

- -A bag of skittles
- -A plate
- -Warm water
- 1. Arrange the Skittles in a circle inside the plate.
- Carefully pour warm (not hot) water into the middle of the plate.
- 3. Watch as the colour of the Skittles slowly creeps to the middle of the plate, making an amazing rainbow.

Science With Dr Ken

Experiment 2: Walking Water

You will need:

- -7 glasses
- -Blue, red and yellow food colouring
- -Water
- -Paper towel



- 1. Put 7 glasses on a table in a line and fill glasses 1, 3, 5 and 7 most of the way with water.
- Add 5-10 drops of red food colouring to glasses 1 and 7. Add
 drops of yellow food colouring to glass 3 and add 5-10
 drops of blue food colouring to glass 5
- 3. Take a paper towel and fold it half way, then fold it again and again and again. Put one side of the folded paper towel into one glass and the other side into the next glass and repeat with the remaining cups.
- 4. Watch what happens as the water climbs the paper towel. Ken says "It was cool and great the way the colours went from one glass to another."

Australia was recently host to the 2023 Power-chair Football World Cup. After seeing an interview with the team on abc News, I showed some of our students the video of the Australian team, The Poweroos, in action, and they were amazed.



The Poweroos play fantastic soccer in specially adapted power wheel-chairs. They are fast, they are strong and they can get the job done as a team. The students thought of some questions that they would like to ask the Poweroos and we heard back immediately from one of the team, Chris Suffield. He sent us some photos, answered the students questions and had this to say:

"Hi everyone! My name is Chris, I'm 34 and I play for the Australian Poweroos. I live with Muscular Dystrophy, which means I can't walk and I use a power wheelchair to get around.

My voice is not very loud, so I use a microphone and speaker system attached to my wheelchair when I play so my teammates can hear me.

This is me alongside Kev, our team mascot. Kev has travelled with the team to France, Brazil and the USA, and he was so proud to cheer the team on in Sydney for the Powerchair Football World Cup!"

Interview with... A Poweroo

How strong are you? How do you get the ball in the goal so fast? **River**—aged 6

We aren't strong enough to walk, but our powerchairs give us the power to hit the ball. We can spin really fast to hit the ball quickly.

What presents do you give to your Mummy? **Alisa**— aged 11

My Mum inspires me to follow my dreams, so I try my best in everything I do to make her proud. My favourite thing to give my Mum is a big hug. She also loves tennis, so we are going to watch some matches in Sydney in January.

Do you listen to The Wiggles 'Hot Potato' or 'Crazy Frog' when you want to chill? **Ojus**— aged 5

Our team loves 'Down Under' by Men at Work, or 'Thunderstruck' by AC/DC to get excited before a match, but I love 'Hot Potato' as well!

Do you go to the shopping centre in your chair? **Nate**—aged 8

We use different chairs when playing football and when having a normal day. I go everywhere in my chair, like going to the shops or visiting friends.

How many medals and trophies do you have? What is the colour of your favourite wheelchair? **Tyrese**— aged 11

I have 10 football trophies in my bedroom at the moment. These are the ones that mean a lot to me, so I keep them where I can see them.

My chair that I play powerchair football in is yellow. I love that it is bright and easy to recognise.



I liked this book. I want a big bum so I can jump on it like a trampoline! Ken— aged 11


I did NOT like this book. I would just like a normal bum to sit on! Tyrese— aged 11
