

Dillon said he would like to be a nurse to help school people.


Investigation Two shows that we have a lot of people who help us at school. From the Rainbow Reporter team and Dillon we give you all a big thumbs up.






It looks like Jarrah learnt some great lessons from reading 'Timeless'.

Ethan made a pretend cake with shaving foam on it and gave it to Deputy Kylie to eat. She got a shock when she tried to cut into it.






When teacher Lindsey wasn't looking, Ethan covered her screen with some black paper. She couldn't work out why she couldn't see anything on her computer!


Watch Out, Ethan's About!

"I'd like to have a swimming pool that is a red colour and has hot water like lava!"






Brooklyn loves...water play! "I found a picture of a swimming pool. I drew my friends and cut them out and pasted them on. We were having fun in the pool."

What is your favourite dinosaur?


Nathaniel loves dinosaurs. He chose six dinosaur images and then went around the school and asked people what their favourite was. Let's see the results.


Interview with...

For those of you who have been doing some extra sports and activities this term to celebrate the Paris Olympics and Paralympics, we hope our interviewees inspire you to keep on trying to reach your goals.



Jacqueline Swick represented Australia in the Women's Eight Rowing Team at the Olympic Games. The team came 4th in the finals which was amazing!

Kane Perris represented Australia in the Mens 1000m tandem time trial at the Paralympics. He has albinism and a vision impairment and rides a bike with another person who is sighted. They came 4th in their final too. So cool!





Taishar Ovens is a 1.0 point Australian wheelchair basketball player. She represented Australia in the 2020 Tokyo Paralympics games.

Interview with...Jacqui Swick

Do you have a pet crab? Dillon, aged 7

I don't have a pet crab but I used to have 3 hermit crabs when I was 9. I used a big clear box, drilled holes in the sides and roof, filled it with sand, shells and whatever I could find down at the beach to keep them happy and entertained! They were my first pet as they are super easy to look after and loads of fun.



What is your favourite sport? Do you need help with sport? River, aged 7

My favourite sport is definitely rowing! I no longer need much help to row but I always have a coach with me. Everyone needs help when they are first learning to do anything. I remember the first time I learnt to row it was in a small pond with a rope attached to my boat that the coach held in case I fell in...which would happen all the time. Learning a new skill or sport can be really frustrating but if you can keep at it you can do anything.

What pet would you like? Nathaniel, aged 6

One day I hope to have a highland cow. I think they are super cute and friendly.

Do you like horses? What do you have for breakfast? Milena, aged 8

I'm not a huge fan of big horses but I do like Shetland pony's - they are a much smaller breed of horse so less intimidating. For breakfast I either like to have eggs on toast, an acai bowl or yogurt and granola. It all depends on what training I have that day and how hungry I am.

Interview with...Jacqui Swick

What is your favourite food? Do you have a dog? Ethan, aged 9

My favourite food at the moment is pistachio ice cream but usually it's anything chocolate. I have a big sweet tooth :) I have a black Labrador named Ruby! She's super energetic, cuddly and cheeky. She loves the beach and anywhere with water.

What country do you train in? Redgum Class

I train in Sydney, Australia but will spend about 3 months in Europe each year competing. So the main countries that I train in are Australia and Italy.

What happens when you get an award? Is there dancing, a party and fireworks? Henry, aged 5

When you come top 3 in a race we are instructed to row over to the podium where we will receive our medal. Usually that night if everyone has finished their racing we will have a party where all the athletes friends and families get together to celebrate the season.

What happens when you get to Paris? Ameliah, aged 10

When we got to Paris each athlete had to fill out a lot of paper work to receive our "accreditation" which is basically a ticket that confirms we are competing at the Olympics and that we are allowed into the village. We then got settled into our accommodation and spent the days leading into our race, training, eating, and sleeping to make sure we were rested and ready to perform.

Interview with...Kane Perris

Do you have a pet crab? Dillon, aged 7

Unfortunately I don't have a pet crab and I've never had a pet crab. We've had cats and dogs and fish and all other pets but I have never had a pet crab before.

What is your favourite sport? Do you need help with sport? River, aged 7

I have 2 favourite sports. One is soccer. I love watching soccer and I used to play soccer but I don't play anymore. And my second favourite...can you guess?!...it's cycling!

I have a sighted pilot who rides on the front of the bike, who does the steering, then myself on the back. I can't see very well but I'm doing the pushing on the pedals.



What pet would you like? Nathaniel, aged 6

I would actually like to get my own big dog. A dog that is big and fluffy and like a big teddy bear, but I'm travelling so much because of my sport at the moment so I'm not sure how I'm going to make that work, but it is a dream of mine to get a big fluffy dog.

Do you like horses? What do you have for breakfast? Milena, aged 8

I do like horses. I think they're very beautiful animals and they're super intelligent.

What do I have for breakfast in the morning? It depends. I will either have 6 Weetbix and milk with some fruit or I will have a bowl of porridge and milk with fruit. It depends how I feel on the day. If I have a really big training day I will have a really big bowl of either of those.

Interview with...Kane Perris

What is your favourite food? Do you have a dog? Ethan, aged 9

My favourite food has got to be pizza. It's my absolute favourite. I actually just had pizza for lunch which was a treat as we have been super focused on what we are eating at the moment and I felt like having a treat.

No, I don't have a dog but I would absolutely love one.

Does your bike have 3 wheels? Is it medium sized? Is it silver and red? Brooklyn, aged 8

My bike doesn't have 3 wheels, it actually has 2. It is a very, very long bike that has 2 people on it. It is a medium sized bike because you can get an even longer one, but we ride faster on a slightly shorter one. Our bike is black and yellow with a big Australia symbol across the bottom of it.

What country do you train in? Redgum Class

I train in Australia, in Perth.

What happens when you get an award? Is there dancing, a party and fireworks? Henry, aged 5

When we get an award and we win a race it is super special. We get to stand on the podium and someone shakes our hand and gives us the medal for the race and it is a super special time because we have worked so hard to get to that point where we are standing there and receiving the award for competing in the race. There is sometimes a bit of a party or we might go out for a dance but it is a nice time to be able to spend time with family and friends and relax after you've competed.

Interview with...Kane Perris

What do you like to eat after the race? What is your favourite colour. What is your biggest and longest supporter? Winston, aged 5

What do I eat after a race? I definitely eat a pizza after a race because that is my favourite food and I enjoy going out and having a big pizza! We have lots of food after we've raced. My favourite colour is blue. My biggest and longest supporter... that's a very good question Winston! It's definitely my parents- my Mum and Dad were absolutely amazing for me growing up with a disability. My parents really helped to teach me that I could do anything I wanted to do, I could be anything I wanted to be and they didn't stop me from doing what I wanted to do when I was growing up. I think that has really helped me to push myself and work really, really hard because my parents showed me that even with a disability you can achieve lots in life.

What is your name for the Olympics? When you visit can you bring your prize? Chloe, aged 5

My name is Kane Perris and I compete in the Mens 1km time trial on the tandem bike. We're actually competing on Sept 1st which is on a weekend so you probably wont be at school then and it is during the day so it could be a good opportunity to watch.

If I have a prize to bring with me I definitely will for sure.

Interview with...Taishar Ovens

Do you have a pet crab? Dillon, aged 7

No I do not have any pet crabs.

What is your favourite sport? Do you need help with sport? River, aged 7

My favourite sport is basketball. However when I play basketball I use a wheelchair to help me.

What pet would you like? Nathaniel, aged 6

I like having a pet dog.

What is your favourite food? Do you have a dog? Ethan, aged 9

My favourite food is homemade lasagna.

Yes I do have a dog. I'll show you a photo of her too. Her name is Bo.

Do you like horses? What do you have for breakfast? Milena, aged 8

Yes I like horses. For breakfast I usually have some toast with butter and Vegemite.

What happens when you get an award? Is there dancing, a party and fireworks? Henry, aged 5

Sometimes when we get an award there is a party but most awards are the teams all together and there is dinner there.


