

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

Student Transitions

School Graduation and Concert

Our 2024 School Concert and Year 6 Graduation will be held on Friday 29 November. Staff and students are already preparing their concert items and we invite families, friends, and community partners to attend. We hope you will join us as we celebrate another exceptional school year.

Reporting to Parents

The Department recently provided clarification around the requirements for end-of-semester student reports. After considering this information, we have reviewed our school's assessment and reporting plan and some minor changes have been made. Families will be asked to provide feedback on their child's report by completing a short survey when the reports are sent home at the end of term.

Student-centred Funding: Disability Allocation

You may be aware that each student at Carson Street receives an Individual Disability Allocation which provides funding for our teaching and learning programs. To ensure the level of funding we receive meets the level of support your child requires, we ask that you send a copy of any documentation written by psychologists, doctors, therapists, or other service providers over the last 12-18 months to the school.

Information can be sent to school with your child in a sealed envelope and returned the same day, or you can email documents to the school. If you prefer to bring information to the school please do SO
