skills through fun motivational games. Jarrah and Reach classes are joining together once a week to develop their soccer skills and learn the value of teamwork. As a school, our focus this term is on our throwing skills, particularly eyes on the target and arm extension. We are also learning to jump for distance and playing fun new games called Cat and Mouse and Rob the Nest.

We're proud of how our students have embraced these activities, staying active and engaged every step of the way!














A message from the Nurses about RSV ...

RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) is a common virus that affects the lungs and airways, spreading easily through coughing and sneezing. It's the leading cause of hospitalisation for babies in Australia.

Signs of RSV:

- Runny nose, coughing, sneezing
- Fever, trouble breathing
- Poor appetite

RSV can cause serious lung issues, especially in babies and children with asthma.

Caring for Your Child:

- Keep them home if unwell, but they can go back to school if feeling better
- Encourage plenty of fluids.

When to See a Doctor:

• High fever, trouble feeding, worsening cough, dehydration.

How RSV Spreads:

RSV spreads through coughing, sneezing, and shared items. It can live on surfaces for hours.

Prevention Tips:

- Avoid sharing drinks, toys, or utensils.
- Wash hands frequently, especially after coughing or sneezing.
- Keep infected children away from newborns and those with weak immune systems.









Wisteria



Early Intervention

Did you know that we had an Early Intervention Program for children aged 0-4 years and their parents at Carson Street School?

The program offers specialised support in early year's development for children with disabilities or for those who are not yet meeting their developmental milestones.

Our Early Intervention Programs - First Steps, Stepping Stones and Milestones provide pre-kindy sessions and all promote and develop social and emotional well-being, communication, cognitive, physical, self-help and play skills in a fun, play-based learning environment, with a clear focus on helping children achieve critical skills.

The EI Program provides:

- a safe and supportive group learning environment where parents/carers can interact, play and grow with their child.
- parents, family members and Disability Support Workers have the opportunity to work with early year's experts to learn how to optimise your child's early years development.
- opportunities to learn skills your child can practice and use in the home environment .
- access to well structured, child focused intervention that is based upon best educational and therapeutic practice.
- opportunities for parents to meet and learn from others experiencing similar challenges to themselves.
- information regarding early intervention services, respite, NDIS and other support for families
